Ensure you have a recording device and/or pen and paper to take notes

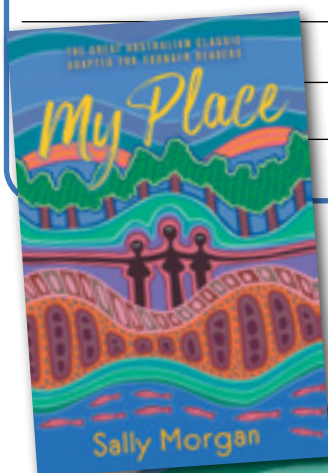
Set a date, time and location for the interview.
