Poignantly told from the child's perspective, *Sister Heart* affirms the power of family and kinship.

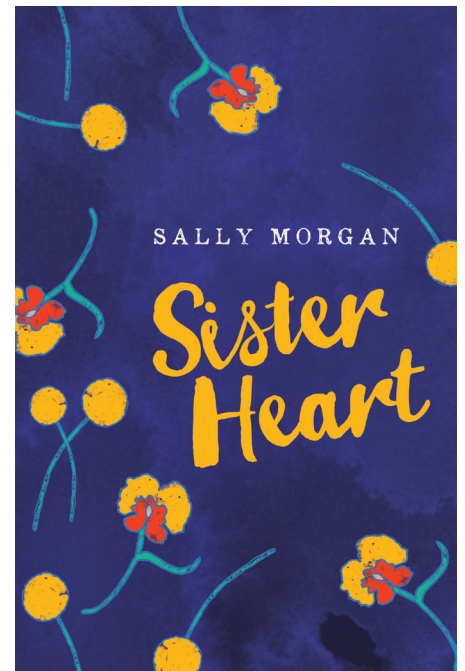
ABOUT THE AUTHOR
