
- The sequel to the successful first book in the series, *The Smuggler's Curse*, which WA children voted their favourite book of 2017.

Norman found himself hauled into the principal's office after the boys' failed attempts to dig up an unmarked grave were discovered.
- This rollicking adventure story highlights little known aspects of Australian history including Dampier's discovery of the Cocos and Christmas Islands, the enslavement of the Malay people on the Cocos islands and the effects of typhoid on 19th Century sailors.
- Jorgensen won the Children's Book Council of Australia's Book of the Year for *In Flanders Fields*.
