*Dark Tales from the Long River* offers a window into an evolving history of Western Australia that is still struggling into the light.


#### **ABOUT THE AUTHOR**

David Price is a Western Australian educator who grew up in the small town of Carnarvon in the 1960s. He has been a teacher, principal and Director of Schools in many parts of the state. Although he now lives in Perth, David has long been intrigued by the hidden history of his hometown and its wilful amnesia about the treatment of Aboriginal people and Asian migrants by the first settlers.



#### **KEY POINTS**

- Covering the years that marked the end of the 19th Century and the beginning of the 20th Century, these self-contained stories combine to evoke an image of life and death in the far flung settlements and pastoral properties that were once isolated outposts of colonial Australia.
- The nine stories of *Dark Tales* provide a backwards glimpse at how the law was used in Western Australia's north-west to subjugate Aboriginal and Asian migrants.
- The events are based mainly around Carnarvon and Shark Bay during the thirty-year reign of the area's first magistrate, Charles D.V. Foss.
- The book uses the accounts from a wide array of newspapers, the reportage itself revealing as much about prevailing views, prejudices and values as the incidents they record.
