Public. Open. Space. is a collection of poetry inspired by spaces, places and situations that are controlled and contested online and in real life. Looking at firewalls and feminism, activism and apathy, Public. Open. Space. explores freedom and suppression, censorship and silencing, propaganda and protest, as well as the difference between being told 'no' and choosing to say it ourselves.

Positioned at the intersection of poetic and digital culture, this collection explores the sense of placelessness and everyplaceness increasingly resonant for all of us who live and work in the digital realm.

Kate Larsen (she/her) is a writer, and arts and cultural consultant currently based on Kaurna yerta in Tarntanya/Adelaide. As one of Australia's best-known social media poets, her alter ego Katie Keys (@tinylittlepoems) wrote and posted a poem daily for over a decade. In 2018, Kate undertook an Asialink Arts Creative Exchange with the Hong Kong Arts Centre, which is where she started working on *Public. Open. Space*.


- Kate Larsen is an art consultant known throughout Australia for her work with major art companies.
