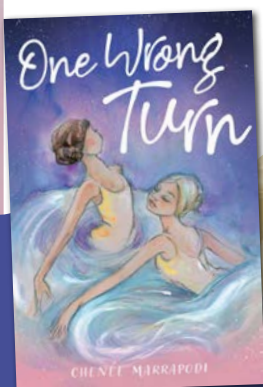

At a family Christmas party, Clara is given a wooden doll which overnight, comes to life and takes her on a magical adventure. The pair battle the Mouse King, travel through many magical lands and meet the Sugar Plum Fairy. Clara wakes on Christmas morning wondering if it was all a dream.

A boy and girl from feuding families fall in love. To avoid marrying someone else, the girl fakes her own death by drinking a potion that makes her seem lifeless. Thinking she is dead, the boy kills himself. The girl wakes, sees his corpse, and dies too.
