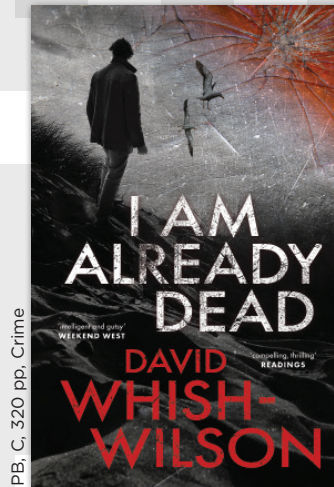


SUMMER OF BLOOD

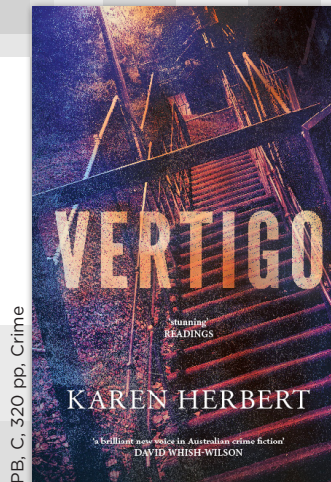
I AM ALREADY DEAD

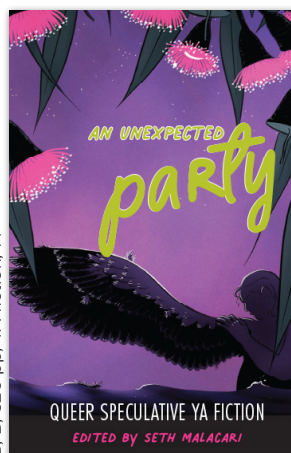
ONE WRONG TURN

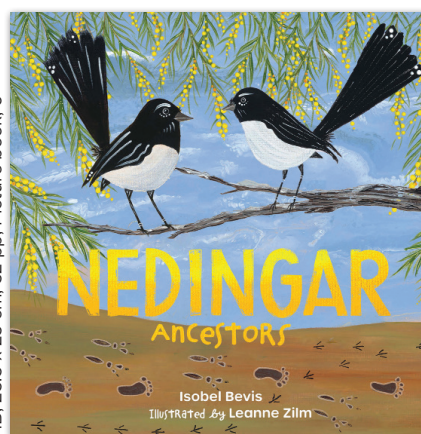

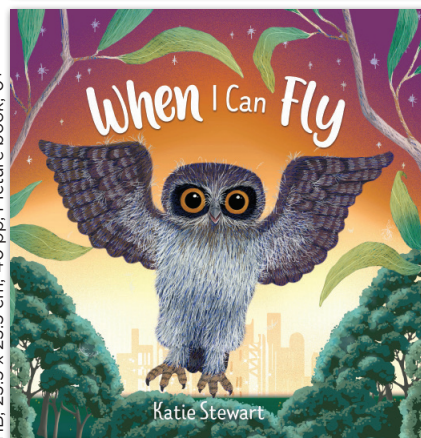


NEDINGAR:ANCESTORS
