Their deaths in the late 1970s marked the end of a tribal lifestyle that stretched back more than 30,000 years. *The Last of the Nomads* tells the journey of Mudjon, a Mandildjara elder, and anthropologist W.J. Peasley, as together they searched for the exiled couple. This is the extraordinary story of the rescue of Warri and Yatungka, and how they survived for thirty years in the unrelenting Gibson Desert.

ABOUT THE AUTHOR


