
ABOUT THE BOOK

ABOUT THE EDITORS

Kirsten Krauth is a Castlemaine-based author and arts journalist, poet and podcaster, and the commissioning editor of the anthologies *Spinning Around: The Kylie Playlist* and *Into Your Arms: Nick Cave's Songs Reimagined*. Her latest novel, *Almost a Mirror*, was shortlisted for the Small Press Network Book of the Year Award and the Penguin Literary Prize, and was named one of *The Guardian*'s Best 20 Books of 2020; her first novel was *just_a_girl*. An 80s tragic, Kirsten received the Donald Horne Fellowship to develop her podcast, *Almost a Mirror*, which revolves around Australian 80s songs and went to number one on the Apple Music Podcast charts.

Angela Savage is an award-winning writer and CEO of Public Libraries Victoria and the commissioning editor, with Kirsten Krauth of *Spinning Around. The Kylie Playlist*. Angela's short stories have been published in Australia and the UK, and she won the 2011 Scarlet Stiletto Award for short crime fiction. Her most recent novel is *Mother of Pearl*. She was a contributor to *Minds Went Walking: Paul Kelly's Songs Reimagined*. Like Kylie, Angela holds a PhD, giving her the Bond villain-like name of Doctor Savage.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. What is it about Kylie that has ensured her longevity and her popularity?
- 2. What words would you use to describe her body of work?
- 3. Why do you think she is a gay icon?
- 4. Do you see her as a feminist icon too?
- 5. What is your favourite story from the collection and why? Thinking about that story, can you answer:
 - a. What is its relationship with the song it was inspired by?
 - b. To what extent are the lyrics or structure of the song visible in the story?
 - c. What is its meaning and does it differ from the meaning of the song?

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- d. Which other story in the collection shares similarities with your favourite? What are they?
- 6. Which story feels the most autobiographical to you (in relation to its author rather than to Kylie)?
- 7. Which story was the most unexpected?
- 8. Which was the most moving?
- 9. Do any common themes arise from the collection?
- 10. Are these aligned with common themes in Kylie's own songs?
- 11. What is your favourite Kylie song/album? Has this answer changed over time?
- 12. If you were to write your own story based on a Kylie song, which song would you choose and why?
- 13. What would that story be about?
- 14. If you were to create an anthology like this one, which artist would you choose to base it on, and which authors would you invite to contribute?
