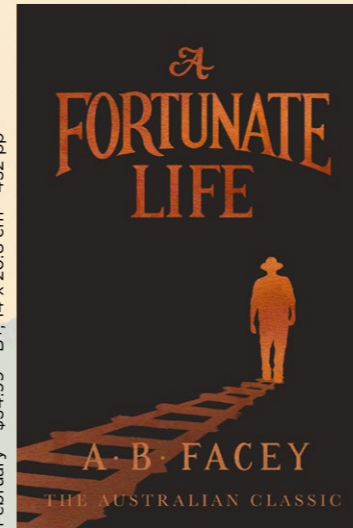


SMASHING SERENDIPITY

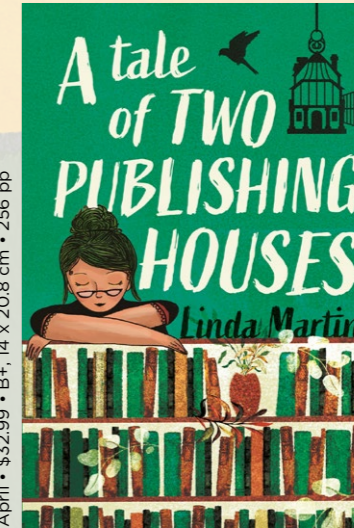


A FORTUNATE LIFE

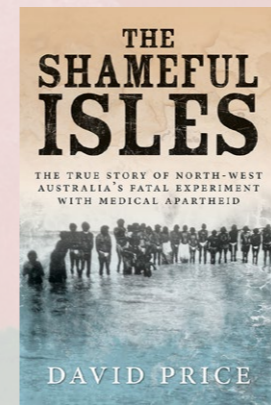

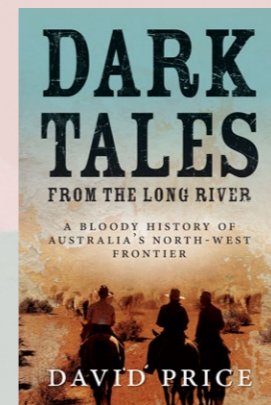

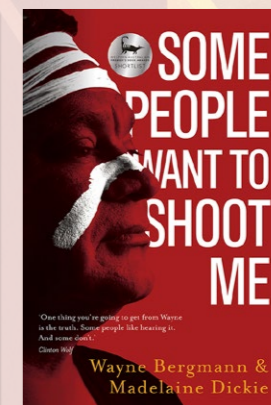
